## A NOTE FROM THE TOWN MANAGER



The Town is excited to announce the long awaited extension of our **Rivertown Trail**. Thanks to a generous donation by Warrick Trails, the ground breaking for Phase III of the trail will take place in April. The trail will connect to the Aurand Trailhead, cross Yorkshire Drive and meander through Driftwood Parke Subdivision and along SR 662 before ending at Pollock Avenue. The project should take less than six months to complete and is a great example of how the Town of Newburgh and Warrick County are collaborating on issues and projects to improve the quality of life for our citizens.

In addition to the trail extension, the Town of Newburgh was awarded over \$800,000 for **road paving projects** through INDOT's Local Roads and Bridges matching grant program. The reconstruction of Sharon Road is included in this grant cycle, as well as the following road segments that will receive a mill and asphalt overlay to extend the useful life of the pavement up to ten years:

- Phelps Drive from SR 662 to south of Williams Lane
- Lamey Lane
- Polk Street from First Street to Third Street
- Jennings Street from Cypress east to dead end
- Adams Street from Jennings to Main Street
- Bartlett Drive
- Carole Place
- Forest Park Drive from Carole Drive to cul-de-sac
- St. Catherine Court from Treelane Drive to Sharon Road
- French Island Trail (micro-surface restoration)

The **pool survey results** are in and being analyzed. While we will have more detailed results in the near future, I thought you would like to know there is overwhelming support for the construction of a new community pool. The Town is dedicating staff and resources for a more focused look at our parks and facilities and how we can improve all. The Parks Board has created a foundation called Park Pals, a 501(c)3 organization dedicated to bettering our parks system and making a new pool a reality, and it will take all of us working together to make it happen. If you haven't already, please reach out to Park Pals via Facebook or contact Town Hall to see how you can help.

In April the Town will start utilizing iWorq, a free app you can download on your phone that will allow you to electronically report issues and track the status of the reported problem. You will also be able to submit permit applications and payments online. Utilizing this program, the Town will be able to recognize trends and streamline processes as well as keep an open line of communication with the public. We are exploring better and more efficient ways to communicate with our citizens including creating an email database (see our new website [newburgh-in.com](http://newburgh-in.com) to register) for future, more frequent e-newsletters.




Paul Campbell stepped down as Fire Chief after ten years in the role. Paul will continue with the Volunteer Fire Department as First Assistant Chief.

## Newburgh Neighbor Grant Program

The Newburgh Historic Preservation Commission expanded the Historic District in 2017 in an effort to further protect historic properties in the Town. While there are grant programs available for commercial properties, there are no grants available for residential properties. In an effort to make grant funds available for residential properties, the Newburgh Historic Preservation Commission has partnered with Historic Newburgh Inc. and is working towards creating the Newburgh Neighbor Grant Program which will be a grant program that will provide funds to residential property owners who own homes located in the Historic Districts. The committee is speaking to several foundations and other organizations and have applied for grants to start the program. In addition to grants, the committee is planning a fundraiser event to help fund the program. The grant funds would be limited to exterior renovations and rehabilitation. While the program is in the very beginning stages of development, the groups are working hard and hope to have the program up and running by late spring. Updates will be provided on social media as the idea continues to progress. ## SIGNS WITHIN PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY



Pursuant to IC 9-21-4-6 and the Newburgh Code of Ordinances Section 157.196, private signs, including political signs are prohibited within the right of way. Please note that signs placed within the public right of way may be removed by the Town staff without prior notice. Town personnel generally remove signs from the right of way as they are encountered in normal street maintenance activities. Removed signs will be taken to the Town Maintenance Facility located at the corner of First and Polk Street, where they can be picked up.



## WARRICK INVASIVE SPECIES PARTNERSHIP

# Waste Management

## WHAT CANNOT BE RECYCLED

### **Plastic Grocery Bags**

Plastic grocery bags can get caught in the recycle sorter & shut the whole system down.

### **Take-Out Containers & Donut Boxes**

Can only be recycled if free from food residue and food waste.

### **Pizza Boxes**

Grease contaminates the raw material. Tear off the untarnished parts and recycle those.

### **Styrofoam**

### **Paper Coffee Cups**

The plastic coating applied to prevent leaking can pose issues to recycling.

### **Shredded Paper**

### **Household Glass**

Items like window panes, mirrors, light bulbs and dishes are dangerous and should be left out of recycling.

### **Wet Paper**

Can make recycling difficult or impossible.

### **Milk & Juice Cartons**

Coated with a thin layer of wax.

### **Baby Diapers**

### **Aerosol Cans**

### **Ceramics & Pottery**

### **Paint, Pesticides, Automobile Fluid, Diesel Fuel, Gasoline, Kerosene, Car Batteries, Automotive Parts & Scrap Metals**

## LIMB PICKUP

Advanced Disposal will pick up small tree limbs. The tree limbs are not to be over 3" in diameter and bundled in lengths not to exceed 4' and not to exceed 30 pounds. It is also helpful for the tie to be brightly colored so the driver can see that the limbs are properly bundled and not just stacked loosely.



We also ask that any limbs or trees that have fallen into the right of way be reported to Town Hall at 812-853-1720. The Street Department will be notified and those obstructions will be removed promptly to ensure everyone's safety.

## HEAVY TRASH PICK UP

### **JUNE 11, 2019**

Town Council wants to let everyone know that Heavy Trash Pickup will be on Tuesday, June 11, 2019. Heavy trash should be placed wherever your trash is normally collected from the home. All heavy trash items must be set out on the scheduled collection day but no earlier than 24 hours before scheduled pick up. Items left out longer may be unsafe for the general public and especially children.

### **Types of Items Collected**

#### **• Indoor/Outdoor Furniture**

Sofas, table, chairs, mattresses, box springs, etc.

#### **• Appliances**

Stoves, washers, dryers, water heaters, etc. Refrigerators and Freezers will be picked up separately and only if the refrigerants have been removed and tagged by a professional.

#### **• Building Material/ Construction Debris**

All building material and construction debris must be in a container and weigh no more than 75 lbs. Containers must be strong enough to hold the contents without breaking apart, even when wet.

#### **• Carpeting**

Carpet must be rolled and bundled and cut into 4 ft. lengths.

### **Items NOT Collected**

- Tires
- Concrete/bricks
- Dirt
- Automobile parts, batteries
- Paint and other hazardous liquids
- Any item longer than 8 feet
- Yard Waste

## Missed Trash and/or Recycle

All missed trash and/or recycle must be reported to Town Hall at 812-853-1720. The Town will notify Advanced Disposal of the missed container.

Reminder: Advanced Disposal starts picking up trash at 6:00am. To ensure your trash and/or recycle is not missed, please have all containers out by 6AM.

## Trash & Recycle Container Curb Removal

Reminder to all residents: per Newburgh Code of Ordinances §50.03, all refuse containers and containers for recyclables shall be removed from the curb side within 24 hours of the time such refuse or recyclables have been removed from the container by the contractor of the town.
